Learning objectives

Acquire multiple perspectives to understand governance and leadership at the global, national, and local levels, including economic, political, legal, and ethical dimensions.

Develop data-analytic skills to assess return on investment and policy impact.

Build specialised knowledge in policy implementation in key areas such as trade, economic policy, social policy, technology, and sustainability, among others.

Develop professional norms and conduct for long-term policy career development.

Acquire a systematic understanding of policy design, implementation, innovation, trade-offs, and effectiveness.

Review critically the assumptions, logic, ethics, and evidence in governance and policy frameworks.

Improve communication, public speaking, and policy memo writing skills for the policy profession.

Programme structure

Compulsory Courses (36 credits)

- Geoeconomics in a Multipolar World
- Trust, Governance, and Leadership
- Social Policy Implementation and Governance: Comparative Perspectives
- Economic Lessons from Turning Points and Crises
- Chinese Leadership and Governance
- Political Ethics in China and the World: Ancient and Modern Perspectives on Public Policy

Elective Courses (18 credits)

- Students choose 3 electives from a broad selection covering climate change, economics, social policy, and law

Capstone Project (12 credits)

- A research thesis or a practice-focused policy project, integrating theory with practice under faculty guidance

Who should apply

- Early-career professionals in government, NGOs, international organisations or corporates seeking governance and policy expertise
- Analysts and consultants aiming to strengthen evidence-based policy skills
- Professionals pivoting into public affairs, regulatory or ESG roles

Career prospects

- Managerial and leadership roles in government, NGOs, multinational corporations, think tanks, and international organizations
- Further academic research or doctoral study on governance and policy
- Leadership positions that require policy innovation and evidence-based analysis to address complex challenges and drive meaningful change globally
